Content	<p>The module in semester 1 is meant for students who have no pre-knowledge in entrepreneurship. The student learns to organise, individually or together with fellow students, a concert based on an entrepreneurial attitude and with basic knowledge of concert organisation, marketing/promotion, finances and communication. The module comprises 10 meetings, including a final test. Before the final test students hand in a project plan and prepare an oral presentation of 10 minutes individually or 20 minutes as a group.</p> <p>The module in semester 2 comprises 9 meetings on different topics related to Project Management and Entrepreneurship. The students have to finish two assignments: organisation of their exam 1-2 and handing in the PIP proposal in which the final exam, including research and entrepreneurship is described. The students take their 'study plan' as a starting point unless the study plan has changed radically.</p> <p>In year 2 (semester 3 en 4) the students develop their PIP proposal into a project plan. During year 2 the students are offered 6 hours of consults with one of the teachers entrepreneurship or an external expert. The duration of a consult can be one hour but if the student prefers, and the teacher agrees, it is possible to divide the consult into two consults of 30 minutes. A list of teachers and external experts will be provided at the beginning of the year. The final assessment is both the assessment of the project plan (according to the criteria which are mentioned in the study guide and based on the framework which is handed out in the first year) and the organisation of the final exam. The oral presentation of the project plan is part of the final PIP presentation.</p>
